ALLENTOWN, Pa. (Jan. 8, 2020) -- Today, PPL Corporation (PPL), whose rich history dates back to 1920, kicks off its year-long celebration to mark its 100th anniversary. Today, PPL and its family of companies, including PPL Electric Utilities, Louisville Gas & Electric Company, Kentucky Utilities Company and Western Power Distribution, are building a smarter, more reliable and more resilient energy grid. The company is investing in new technology that is reshaping electricity networks, enabling more distributed energy resources and advancing a cleaner energy future.

"PPL's 100-year history is rich with growth and success, but it is nothing without the thousands of dedicated employees – past and present – who have powered progress in our cities, towns and communities," said William H.
