Fresh Approach to Teaching Brings Its Rewards

Students from Beacon Infant School in Bodmin will be extending their learning into the outdoors and doing something positive for the whole school in the coming months.

Children from Key Stage 1, involving 4 classes, will have time set aside each day in the curriculum to take their learning outside, starting with the planting of fruit trees to help create a small orchard in the school.

Thanks to support from Western Power Distribution, they will be planting a Cornish apple tree and a Cornish plum tree plus a selection of native trees and hedgerows to encourage wildlife and birds.

Showing the children how to care for the trees and creating a sense of excitement about what they can expect to harvest from them is very rewarding."

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
