

Powerful Investment for Corby

Western Power Distribution

An £3 million project to safeguard power supplies to local homes and businesses has been completed in Corby.

Western Power Distribution (WPD), the electricity distributor for the Midlands region, is committed to investing in its network to further improve supply reliability and customer service levels.

This new initiative involves replacing and upgrading two transformers in a major substation, which supplies power to 35,000 customers in Corby, Oundle, Oakley and the surrounding areas.

The investment is also designed to better accommodate any increased demands placed on the power network in the future for additional developments.

WPD's Projects Distribution Manager Patrick Booth said: "It ensures that we can provide a high level of service to these areas in the long term by improving the infrastructure and security of our electricity network."

The work, which took fifteen months to complete, forms part of WPD's commitment to provide a consistently high level of service to customers. It is investing around £2 billion on its electricity network between 2010 and 2015.
