Field trips to various venues like Susquehanna's control room simulator, emergency operations center and environmental lab demonstrate the real-life use of the concepts covered.

"Sharing real-life examples of how science is used every day in a major industry will engage students and encourage them to think about their role in shaping our energy future," said Mimi Mylin, senior information specialist for PPL.

David Simpson, associate professor from Bloomsburg University, will help teach much of the course. Participants in the course also will meet a number of industry experts, including David Allard, the director of the state Bureau of Radiation Protection; Brian Mangan, King's College professor of environmental studies; and many professionals from Susquehanna.

Educators will earn three continuing professional development credits, processed through the Northeast Intermediate Unit for a fee of \$60. The course itself is free.
