Organizations across Kentucky awarded tree planting grants by LG&E and KU

In Boyle County - The City of Danville.

In Mercer County - The City of Harrodsburg.

In Taylor County - Campbellsville University.

Hopkins County - The Western KY 4-H Camp Improvement Committee.

"To date, the Plant for the Planet grant program has partnered to support the planting of more than 40,000 trees across our service territories and the grants awarded to these organizations will further grow that number," said LG&E and KU Director of Corporate Responsibility and Community Affairs Angie Evans. "The benefits these trees will bring to our communities for years to come is a great example of the powerful impact we can have when we work together."

Since the grant program's launch in 2009, plantings have occurred in a range of urban and rural settings that offer public access, including parks and nature preserves. Many successful projects have also used unique approaches to incorporate trees within other landscape settings.

The Plant for the Planet program is modeled after the United Nations' Plant for the Planet: Billion Tree Campaign which promotes the planting of more than one billion trees annually by individuals, communities and businesses worldwide.
