Last chance to apply for summer electric bill help through LIHEAP

Applications for federal assistance grants being accepted through Aug. 31

ALLENTOWN, Pa. (Aug. 13, 2020) -- Federal assistance for PPL Electric Utilities customers to help with their electric bill is still available, but time is running short.

The federal government's Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) Recovery Crisis Program will run through Aug. 31, or until remaining funds are exhausted, whichever comes first.
