

# Winners of PPL's Safety Poster Contest Announced

PPL's electrical safety poster contest has attracted thousands of educators and tens of thousands of students in public, private and parochial schools during its 16-year history.

The poster contest began as an outgrowth of PPL's K-12 energy education curriculum, developed in the late 1970s by the company and a core group of 60 educators from throughout Pennsylvania.

Prizes in the competition are five shares of PPL Corporation stock for grand-prize winners, two shares for first place and one share for honorable mention. All students who send in artwork receive a personalized certificate of appreciation from PPL.

The 12 grand-prize posters will be featured on PPL's 2002 electrical safety poster calendar that is distributed to all participating schools to reinforce electrical safety throughout the new year.

Teachers of grand-prize winners will receive \$50 from PPL for instructional materials and supplies. All teachers will receive a PPL 12-inch electrical safety ruler, which features important tips so they can remind their students to always be safe around electrical components.
