He is chairman of the Pennsylvania Business Roundtable's Workforce Development Task Force. The task force has set statewide strategies that address the state's economic health by concentrating on workforce readiness, career awareness and life-long learning.

He is a member of the Utility Business Education Coalition, a national organization that engages businesses to help improve educational results for students and strengthen local economies. Sparta is also a member of the Pennsylvania Center for Environmental Education Business and Industry Council; chairman of the Bethlehem Area Vocational-Technical School's Local Advisory Council; and a member of the Lehigh County Career and Technical Institute Steering Committee.
