Under an agreement reached Tuesday (8/17), PPL Electric Utilities will have immediate access to park service land to perform needed vegetation maintenance work on the 1.5-mile section of 230-kilovolt power line. The company also will be entitled to perform routine vegetation maintenance in future years, after reasonable advance notice.
